Chairperson's Report

The last year in dairying for South Australia has again provided some challenging times for the industry. A disappointing 2014 spring meant that most farms conserved considerably less hay and silage and feed through the summer was tight. Despite this, a relatively good autumn start and mild winter meant that the situation was, in the most part, manageable. This possibly contributed to statewide production increasing 2014-2015 with over 549 million litres produced, up on 2013-2014 (536 million litres).

DairySA continued its strong focus on forage projects with the new Hills and Fleurieu Forage Network project commencing in autumn 2015. This project brings strong technical support in forage planning for individual farms. It's pleasing to see this one-to-one extension again gaining a foothold in the industry providing dairy farm businesses access to tailored forage extension on their farms.

Supporting the development of business and financial skills on dairy farms continues to be a priority in DairySA and this year we provided support for fourteen SA dairy businesses to access tailored Succession and Transition Planning Advice. The feedback from this program was excellent with participating farmers saying that the funding and advice provided them with a strong catalyst to progress their succession planning for the future of their farm businesses.

We were very pleased to be among recipients of funding from the inaugural grant round by the SA Dairy Industry Fund through the innovative and successful SADA Fresh brand. This is an excellent example of industry taking charge of its future – well done to all involved.

Always a highlight of the DairySA calendar, we again coordinated and hosted the DairySA Central Conference in Hahndorf and Innovation Day in Mount Gambier. This is an excellent opportunity to not only showcase leading projects and research, development, extension and education (RDE&E) but also connect with industry representatives, colleagues and friends. John Mulvany captivated the Central Conference audience with his wisdom and real-life farmer experiences while Innovation Day participants learnt many lessons from US speaker Brian Houin.

As I move on from DairySA and reflect on the past 10 or so years it's pleasing to see that the breadth and reach of the organisation touches many more dairy businesses in South Australia with practical extension and education. Having expanded the DairySA team, brand and work to encompass the broad South Australia dairy community means, we can have a bigger and more meaningful impact on more farms across the State. The Board has worked hard to remain aligned with our traditional roles on coordinating farmer-driven RDE&E in SA while expanding how we do this by offering tailored services for dairy businesses through our many and varied projects and alignment with Dairy Australia.

The DairySA team has again strived hard to deliver something for everyone in the industry. Their diverse skills, commitment to the industry and ability to coordinate an action-packed and interesting DairySA calendar each year is commendable to them all.

My thanks to the DairySA Board as well as past Board members over my tenure with whom I have had the pleasure of spending many meetings, as well as sharing interesting conversations both on DairySA business and generally. You've been an excellent support to me over the years and your contributions to the industry do not go unnoticed.

The DairySA Region

DairySA Regional Development Program covers all dairying regions of South Australia and includes the South East, Adelaide Hills, Fleurieu, Murray Lands and the Barossa Mid North. These farming regions all have different issues to deal with due to their climatic conditions, natural resources, infrastructure, processing, service industries and growth capabilities.

The 2014-2015 farm statistics from the Dairy Authority of South Australia indicate a drop in farm numbers from the previous year (-4.1%), bringing the total number of farms in South Australia to 252. Cow numbers also decreased slightly by 0.29%.

DairySA delivers regionally focused practical activities and information to support farm profitability and sustainability. DairySA is an example of the dairy services levy at work, locally. It is one of eight Regional Development Programs (RDPs) funded by Dairy Australia and the dairy service levy.

Some roles of DairySA include:

- Providing funding for research, development, education and extension (RDE&E) activities in SA.
- Developing projects and workshops based on dairy farmers' feedback (what they want, when they
 want it).
- Managing specific RDE&E projects for South Australian dairy farmers.
- Coordinating dairy farmers' events.
- Seeking leverage funds to ensure the dairy service levy is maximised in South Australia.

DairySA's focus is RDE&E and it is not a lobbying or political body.

The DairySA Board

A Board of Directors governs DairySA. The Board meets bi-monthly. The role of the Board is to ensure that the work of DairySA and the funding received by the organisation are directed to regionally relevant research and development.



DairySA funding

In 2014-2015, Dairy Australia allocated \$229,599 core funding to DairySA. This was a decrease of around 6% from the previous financial year. DairySA continued to develop and deliver programs and significantly leveraged cash and in-kind contributions from other sources.

Total investment in dairy related programs through DairySA totalled \$966,962.



Major sources of external funds were accessed through the Department of Agriculture, PIRSA, NRM Boards and various businesses.





Note 1: Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act of South Australia 1985. The committee has determined that the Association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act of South Australia and the following applicable Accounting Standards:

AASB 1031: Materiality

No other applicable accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The report is prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this report:

(a) Income Tax


No provision for income tax has been raised as the association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.
