



# Chairman's report

The past year has seen DairySA delivering a bigger and more meaningful impact on more farms across the State, providing practical and relevant programs for dairy farmers and their businesses. The Board has been mindful of staying aligned with its core role to provide farmer-driven projects and services, whilst overlaying this framework with tailored, responsive and timely support. This supported many in the SA dairy community to manage and ride the storms that were to present in the latter half of the year.

However, it was the closing months of the 2016 Financial Year that presented some of the most challenging times ever experienced in the dairy industry. Without much warning, milk prices dropped quickly and considerably, putting increasing pressure on many dairy farm businesses. Against this background there were some slight positive shifts in input costs to offset these challenges - with potential decreases in feed prices, fertiliser and fuel - and going forward it's a matter of capitalising on these positives whilst managing the challenges.

The ongoing promotion, delivery and support for DairyBase in SA has continued to reap benefits for dairy businesses across the State and its success is testament to the team heading in the right direction. Using DairyBase as a cornerstone to focus projects on profitability is part of DairySA's long-term business strategy.

DairySA's Central Conference in McLaren Vale and Innovation Day in Mount Gambier were once again highlights of the DairySA calendar. Both showcased world class RDE &E projects and importantly created an excellent opportunity to connect industry representatives, colleagues and friends - vital in challenging times. DairySA's Innovation Day focus on 'Herd Innovation and Business Inspiration' was admirably met by keynote speaker Dr Jim Spain from the US, together with Limestone Coast dairy farmer Andrew Cavill, resulting in overwhelmingly positive feedback.

DairvSA's work has continued to have a solid impact on South Australia's dairy farms. One of the most satisfying elements of my role this past year has been seeing the tangible outcomes for farmers and their businesses, a reminder that all our work is directly related to farm profitability. DairySA is mindful that there is no 'one size fits all' for the dairy industry. Through elements such as DairyBase our programs are tailored to meet the demands and expectations of individual businesses, resulting in the most meaningful and useful results for farmers.

In short, we have continued to 'get on with the job'.

My thanks to the DairySA Team who work tirelessly to bring practical, relevant and tailored projects and services to the farm-gate and to the Board who remain committed to ensuring DairySA has farm profitability at its core, and whose skills, dedication and enthusiasm for a healthy dairy industry make it a

### Our role

DairySA is one of eight Regional Development Programs (RDPs) funded by Dairy Australia and the dairy service levy. DairySA exemplifies the dairy services levy at work, locally.

DairySA is committed to delivering regionally focused, farmer driven, practical activities and information to support farm profitability and sustainability across South Australia.

Some roles of DairySA include:

- providing funding for research, development, education and extension (RDE&E) activities in SA
- developing projects and workshops based on dairy farmers' feedback (what they want, when they want it)
- managing specific RDE&E projects for South Australian dairy farmers
- > coordinating dairy farmers' events
- seeking leverage funds to ensure the dairy service levy is maximised in South Australia.

DairySA's focus is RDE&E and it is not a lobbying or political body.



# Our region

The DairySA Regional Development Program covers all dairying regions in South Australia.

There are 252 dairy farms in South Australia, clustered amongst the Adelaide Hills, Barossa Mid-North, Fleurieu, Lower Murray and South East.

Each region features a unique set of climatic conditions, natural resources, infrastructure, processing, service industries and growth capabilities, and thus face different challenges and opportunities.

The 2015–2016 farm statistics from the Dairy Authority of South Australia indicate a drop in farm numbers from the previous year (-3.17%), bringing the total number of farms in South Australia to 244. Cow numbers decreased by 2.16%.






# **Our funding**

In 2015–2016, Dairy Australia allocated \$260,000 core funding to DairySA and an additional \$328,600 allocated from Dairy Australia program delivery in South Australia. DairySA continued to develop and deliver programs and significantly leveraged cash (\$330,305) and in-kind contributions from other sources. Board, management and Governance costs of the business were 17% of the total budget.

Major sources of external funds were accessed through the Department of Agriculture, PIRSA, NRM Boards, the SA Dairy Industry Fund and various businesses.



Total investment in dairy related programs through DairySA totalled \$962,884.

#### Note 1: Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act of South Australia 1985. The committee has determined that the Association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act of South Australia and the following applicable Accounting Standards:

AASB 110: Events Occurring After Reporting Date

AASB 1031: Materiality

No other applicable accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The report is prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this report:

(a) Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(b) Goods and Services Tax

Revenues and expenses are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST) except where the amount of GST is not recoverable or payable to the Australian Taxation Office.

Receivables and Payables are recognised inclusive of GST.

The net amount of GST recoverable from or payable to the Australian Taxation Office is shown separately in the Balance Sheet.
